The Education and Employment program of the National Women's Law Center (NWLC) is looking for a lawyer who is available for at least six months, whether through a law firm program or a fellowship program sponsored by an organization such as Equal Justice Works or Georgetown's Women's Law and Public Policy, or who is otherwise interested in supporting the Center's work on a volunteer basis.

Organization

For over 35 years, the NWLC has led the way in expanding possibilities for women and girls in the United States. NWLC uses the law in all its forms to protect and advance the progress of women and girls at work, in school, and in virtually every aspect of their lives. NWLC takes on the issues that cut to the core of women's and girls' lives in education, employment, family economic security, and health, with special priority given to the needs of low-income women and their families.

The Education and Employment Program Area

The Center's *Education and Employment* program area uses a variety of tools – including litigation, legislative work and public education – to improve the legal standards applicable to the protection of women's rights and to advance gender equity in a variety of education and employment settings. Responsibilities may include researching and analyzing policy and legal issues and drafting a variety of materials, such as memos, fact sheets, reports, comments on regulations and legal briefs.

Qualifications

Law degree required. Must have excellent analytical, oral and written communications and organizational skills, attention to detail, and a commitment to women's issues. Starting date negotiable.
