

## **Immunizations and Health Records**

A [list of required immunizations](#) is available on the Health Services website. Additionally, [this form](#) must be sent in to Northwestern University Health Service (633 Emerson Street – Evanston, IL. 60208). It contains a list of all required immunizations and a list of questions on page 3 that will help you determine whether you need a TB test. International students who need a TB test will have until 30 days after the start of classes to complete the test. University Health Services can perform the test. Call 847-491-2204 to schedule a TB test. If you have additional questions, refer to the list of [Frequently Asked Questions](#) on the Health Services website.

## **Housing**

## **Computers**

[Northwestern University Information Technology \(NUIT\)](#) has a number of resources that can help you to purchase what you need directly, or to get a discount on your technology needs.

If you need to buy a computer: Unfortunately, Northwestern does NOT have an umbrella laptop purchase program allowing you to buy a computer directly from the school. However, many stores or computer companies offer student discounts. The school has compiled a list of vendors and purchasing options for students at [http://www.northwestern.edu/userservices/purchasing/programs\\_initiatives/personal-purchases.html](http://www.northwestern.edu/userservices/purchasing/programs_initiatives/personal-purchases.html). Here, you will find direct links to online stores from which you can purchase some items at a discounted rate. For example, the [link to the Apple store](#) website will take you directly to the Apple store webpage associated with Northwestern, allowing you to purchase a computer at a discounted student rate. For those of you who prefer PCs, there is also a [link to Dell's website](#), which will

again take you directly to the page associated with Northwestern. There is no need to enter any code or information to get the student price. If you prefer to purchase your laptop from a physical store, do not hesitate to ask if there is a student discount available—many places offer them. You may need to show your Wildcard.

If you need to purchase software such as Microsoft Word: NUIT also has [links to purchase software online](#) at a student rate. To purchase software for your personal computer, go to [this link](#) and click on “Start Shopping” at the bottom of the page. You will need to sign in with your NetID and password. Once you sign in, you should automatically be on the Microsoft software page. To purchase Microsoft Office, click on the title you would like (the school currently offers Office 365 University, which includes Word, Excel, PowerPoint, OneNote, and Outlook), add it to your online shopping cart, and check out. You can pay using PayPal or a credit card (Visa, MasterCard, or American Express). Please note that this is an electronic download. You will not receive a physical disk containing the program. Instead, you will receive a download and code.

### **Students Accounts**

The Office of Student Accounts handles payment for tuition and related fees. Basic information about the tuition payment process is available [here](#). Fall semester payments are due in full by September 1 if you are not enrolled in the 9PAY installment payment plan, for which the first payment was due July 1.

Payments can be made online through CAESAR (eBill & ePay), in person by check, cash, or money order (Room 120 in Abbott Hall, the building across Superior Street from the law school building), or by mailing a copy of the billing statement along with your check or money order made out to Northwestern University to:

If you have financial aid (scholarships, loans, etc.) that cover the entire cost of your tuition and fees, the school will automatically apply those funds to your account and you will not need to do anything to ensure that your tuition is paid. Any excess will be refunded to you. The school’s default is to send a check to the current address that the school has on file. Alternatively, you can arrange to have funds direct deposited to your bank account. To update your address or provide information for a direct deposit, enter the information in CAESAR.
