Course: Law Practice Field Studies

This course is open only to JD students who will be doing an internship during the summer following their first or second year of law school in a country other than their home country. The internship may be paid or unpaid.

Students will be enrolled in the course following the approval of their CPT request by the Director of International Programs and the Registrar. The course is not biddable and does not count against the maximum summer enrollment.

Syllabus will be available on Canvas and may include a combination of (1) weekly reflective journals and/or (2) final comment or paper on a law topic related to but not directly overlapping with legal issues explored and worked on during the summer internship or on a comparative law or legal profession topic related to the country in which the internship took place.

- Instruction will be remote to accommodate students interning in the summer in various locations outside Chicago.
- The course will earn one credit. The written work will not satisfy the graduation writing requirement.
- Students must complete the written work by the end of the Summer exam period.
- The course will be graded in accordance with the Law School grading policy.

Students may not enroll in Law Practice Field Studies after graduating from the Law School or completing the requirements for the JD degree.

International students on the F-1 student visa should be able to use Curricular Practical Training (CPT) work authorization to take this course. Please see the Office of International Student and Scholar Services for instructions regarding CPT.
